24 Hour Urine Collections

Principle

To provide patient instructions for the collection of a 24-hour urine specimen for the laboratory analysis and ensure proper specimen collection and handling of specimens submitted to the laboratory for testing

Collection Process

- 1. Instruct the patient to void and discard the first urine specimen at a specific time (e.g., 8 AM).
- 2. Record the time of this initial voiding.
- Use a waterproof pen or label to write the patient's full name, date of birth or medical record number, and the date and time the collection started (e.g., "Start: 8 AM on [date]"), and the date and time the collection ended. A patient label may also be used if available.
- 4. Collect all subsequent urine specimens throughout the 24-hour period in a clean 24 hour urine collection container. Use a second container if necessary.
- 5. Keep container on ice or refrigerate during collection.
- Include the final urine specimen voided at the end of the 24-hour collection period (e.g., 8 AM the following day).
- 7. Screw the lid on securely. Transport the specimen promptly to the laboratory at the end of the collection period.
- 8. If any urine is lost during the collection period (incontinence, spills, discarded on accident) the process must be restarted with a new container and collection period.
